- Provides coupons for infant formula, cereal, juice, milk, cheese, eggs and other food for women who are pregnant, breastfeeding or who have a child under five years of age
- Also, provides nutritional education and referrals to health service providers for both mother and child

*Project Fresh; (810) 237-4537*

- Provides coupons which may be used at the Flint Farmers Market to purchase Michigan-grown fresh fruit and vegetables (summer time only)
- Service for Genesee County residents that are pregnant, postpartum, and breast-feeding women, infants and children through age five who meet income eligibility criteria
- Eligibility based on household income
- Documents required: Photo identification, Proof of income, Proof of family size, Proof of residency
- Call to schedule appointment; Mon-Fri 8am-5pm

- Open to anyone with children 3 and above
- Call to apply, Mon-Thurs 11am-5pm
- Services are free of charge and include:
  - Free pregnancy testing (Walk-in or by appointment)
  - Community services referrals
  - Pre-natal & post-natal support
  - Abstinence education
  - “Her Choice” 24hr taped messages
  - Information on STD’s
  - Other valuable services

- Picture ID and piece of mail with address showing current 48506 zip code required
- If requesting baby services Medicaid card for the child is required
- Allowed to receive items twice a month, but may make exception for emergencies
- Clothing ministry: Clothing, household items, appliances and furniture
- Infants ministry: Diapers, formula, clothing, blankets, strollers and other needs

- Maintains a pantry with maternity clothing, clothing for infants and toddlers, nursery furniture, diapers, and baby food/formula when available
- Individuals who are pregnant or have young children may receive services once a month
- Call to apply; Mon-Fri 10am-2:45pm
- Documents required:
  - Picture ID for applicant
  - Form of ID for the child, such as birth certificate or Medicaid card required
- A deposit of \$10-25 per item is charged for baby furniture and car seats. Deposit is refunded when items are returned
- Fee depends on condition of the item

- Inform the families of other places where they can get more diapers for free as well
- Priority is given to pregnant mothers and infants. No toddlers (18 months-2 years) please
- After filling out our form or using toll-free hot-line, someone will call you and answer your questions
- IMPORTANT! Return calls come from a 248-764-XXXX
- You CAN get diapers from them even if you are receiving diapers from another organization or somewhere else
- Requirements:
  - You must have Medicaid to receive diapers
  - You must be a resident in the counties of, Macomb, Oakland, or Genesee
  - Calls must be direct from the family
  - One request per household at a time
