# Double Up Food Bucks; (866) 586-2796

- If you have a Bridge Card, you can use this program
- Any purchase of milk or fresh, frozen, dried, or canned fruits and vegetables (with no added salt, sugar, or oil) with your Bridge Card earns Food Bucks
- Can earn up to \$20 in Double Up credits daily

# Commodity Supplemental Food Program

- Provides eligible individuals with a wide variety of nutritious food items and nutrition information
- Food is distributed once a month and should provide 12-15 days of complete, balanced meals
- Parents with children under five years' old who do not qualify for the Women's-Infants'-Children's (WIC)
   Nutrition Supplement program or individuals age 60 and older are eligible for this service
- Income guidelines apply, call for more details
- Telephone to apply, walk-ins accepted
- Documents required: Proof of income, Residency, Birth date, Family size, Birth certificates/picture ID for all members in household
- Site hours: Mon-Thu 8:30am-4pm; Fri 8:30am-3pm
