- Residents of Washtenaw Co may call HAWC for housing assistance, information and/or referrals
 - Please note: There is a severe shortage of housing resources and resources are limited
- Eligibility will be determined, referrals, education, and assistance will be provided

- The program is designed to bring eligible property owners' dwellings into compliance with common housing standards to provide safe, decent and affordable housing for Washtenaw Co residents
- Assistance available for income-eligible homeowners within an eligible Urban County jurisdiction
- Available on a "first-come, first-served" basis
- There is a waiting list for qualified applicants who are not selected for the current cycle of funding
- Homeowners must reside within an Urban County jurisdictions meet household income limits

Emergency Shelter (Safe Stay)

- If you are 10-17 years old, offers a welcoming place for you if you need a safe place to stay or a break from conflict at home
- You can stay at Safe Stay for up to 3 weeks
- After leaving Safe Stay, they help you return to a safe home with a personalized action plan and ongoing therapy and services

Transitional Living (Miller House)

- If you are ages 17-20 and do not have a stable or safe home
- You may stay at Miller House for up to 18 months
- When you are ready to leave Miller House and move into your own home, you leave with your saving and continued access to critical Ozone House support services

Supported Opportunities for Living on Your Own (SOLO)

 Ozone House partners with other homeless providers in the county to offer permanent supportive housing for youth 18-21 with disabilities

 - Will need to show proof of stable housing
 - Proof of income

- They will hold purchased items for up to three days for customers
- Veterans and Active Service Military receive a 10% discount on purchases
- Merchandise may be held for 3 hours only, from the time of the request. Customers may request one hold per item, per day. No overnight holds
