The Regional Alliance for Healthy Schools (RAHS) has been serving the community for 25 years. RAHS' 17 school-based health centers in Washtenaw and Genesee Counties, including the the RAHS mobile unit, serve as a safety net for students and youth, providing comprehensive physical and mental health services to youth 0-21, regardless of where they attend school and their ability to pay. Also, RAHS provides ancillary services, vision and dental, in addition to expanding to on-site physical therapy services. RAHS staff identify gaps in care, and assist families with addressing social determinants of health; providing a variety of resources to vulnerable and underserved communities.
