

2024 Prescription for Health

2024 Prescription for Health-Referring Partner Staff Information

In partnership with Washtenaw County Health Department, we are participating in a program called Prescription for Health that will provide tokens for patients/clients to purchase fresh fruits, fresh vegetables, and fruit/vegetable plants/seeds from participating farmers markets and farm stands in Washtenaw County.

Program Goals:

- 1. Increase consumption of fresh fruits and vegetables among participants
- Foster healthy behavior change in program participants by providing nutrition education, referrals to community resources, and support from Community Health Workers
- 3. Create strong partnerships between the local public health department, clinics, and farmers markets to increase awareness of the local food system, promote utilization of community resources, and support participant health improvement
- 4. Support development of the local food system and economy

Eligible Participants*:

- · Food insecurity for fruits and vegetables
- Chronic disease risk
- Ability and willingness to commit to using the full benefit of the program (i.e. spending \$100 in paper tokens by 11/30/24)

^{*}Must also live in Washtenaw County



Program Summary:

- Clinician fills out the referral form, selecting the farmers market location the participant will pick up their enrollment packet. Clinician submits the completed referral form to Prescription for Health staff.
- Each participant receives \$100 in paper tokens in their enrollment packet.
- Participants can purchase fresh fruits, fresh vegetables, and fruit/vegetable
 plants/seeds with the Prescription for Health paper tokens at participating farmers
 markets and farm stands in Washtenaw County. A list of participating locations is
 included in the enrollment packet given to participants.
- As part of the program, program staff provide nutrition education, support, refer to resources, and help participants set realistic, healthy eating and living goals.
