Why School-Based Health Centers Matter

SBHCs serve as a lifeline for students, offering physical and behavioral health care as well as vision and dental services right where students spend most of their time—at school. We reduce barriers such as transportation, lack of access to providers, and financial obstacles by bringing care directly to our youth and adolescents. We know that when children and teens are healthy, they are better prepared to succeed in the classroom and beyond. Whether it's providing routine check-ups, behavioral health support, vaccinations, vision checks, or managing chronic conditions, our work has a lasting impact on children's lives. According to the National School-Based Health Alliance, the following is what makes SBHCs essential:

- Improved academic outcomes: Students who use SBHCs often show better attendance, higher grades, and increased graduation rates.
- Access to equitable care: SBHCs provide a safety net for underserved youth and adolescents, addressing disparities in health outcomes.
- Whole-child approach: SBHCs ensure comprehensive care for students by integrating physical and behavioral health care services.
